



The Nostalgia of

Prashant Raj Dahal

VIDEO GAMES HAVE always fascinated people as they provide a fun and entertaining time for both who play and the ones who sit beside and watch them play. From the inception of Pong, the first video game developed in October 1958 by physicist William Higinbotham, to massive scale open world games (GTA franchises and the likes) to the introduction of Virtual Reality (VR) in the past couple of years, we sure have come a long way. Although the first video games didn't make it to Nepal for a long time as computers were still evolving in the West and were expensive, Nepalese got their first hands-on with Video Gaming from the likes of Game Boy Advanced and Chinese Brick Games that began during the 90s. `

In 1989, the first Game Boy console was released. Since Japanese products were in general a lot more popular here in the 90s, these handheld gaming consoles quickly made their way into the country. It was expensive and initially only a handful of people could afford it. As the years passed by, more and more people bought handheld gaming consoles. Chinese companies saw the opportunity of video gaming and made Brick games and Game Boy rip-offs for the Asian market. This was a time when Personal Computers (PC) were still too expensive in Nepal and also around the world. So most people

got their first experience with video gaming from these handheld gaming consoles rather than PC.


As a person born in 1997, Brick Games, PSPs, and Game Boys had a massive presence (and influence) while I was growing up. Sure PC Games were also a thing but these handhelds were more popular, possibly because we kids had no idea how to install of a game on a PC. If you remember, these Game Boy used these cartridges for different games. All you had to do was pop a cartridge and you could start playing a whole different game, which was much easier than installing

a game on a PC. I still vividly remember going to Lagankhel to buy cartridges for games I loved. Sometimes I even used to make it all the way to Mahabaudha to get the game cartridges that I was looking for. Exchanging and borrowing cartridges were a huge thing back in school. Kids who got caught by school authorities would plead to them to return them back.

While Game Boy was popular, it was still expensive. That's where Brick Games fit right in. These Chinese Brick

Games cost a mere 75-200 Rs. and exactly had 100 games in them. So these brick games were super popular through the mid-2000s. Everything eventually comes to an end. Game Boy and Brick Games saw their decline after the mid-2000s. Thanks to PCs getting relatively cheaper and cheaper and more Chinese companies making rip-off versions of the Game Boy that were less expensive, Game Boy soon lost its market in Nepal as well as the world, and was replaced by the more advanced PSP handhelds, Play Station Consoles, X Box and of course, Personal Computers.



Why I Love Mandalas?

Mandala is a graphic symbol of the universe, but painting one is an art, a meditation

THE ART OF making mandala is not an easy endeavor. It requires countless hours of patience, and focus - skills which are not easy to master. Sanjita Shahi's love for mandalas began in 2016, when she turned her hobby into a full time profession. She has now been organizing workshops to pass on the knowledge to those who wish to create mandala art. We sat down with Sajita to know why she loves mandalas.

How long has it been? I started making mandalas as a

hobby in 2016. I didn't think at that time that it would turn into my career. I began with basic doodling, watching numerous videos on youtube. I always like to try new things and the process of making mandala has had a very positive impact in my life.

Why do you love mandalas so much?

The process of making a mandalas is a very creative process. I have always been interested in art. I used to make portraits and was not into symmetric art. The process of making a mandala is compared to a process of meditation. It is a very relaxing process. It helps divert one's mind and has healing effects. I was going thorough a low phase of life in 2015, that's when I formally started taking art seriously. It became an escape for me, and it helped me overcome my hurdles and challenges. I didn't have this set up. I started in my room with a tiny table, played music and just immersed myself into making mandala.

The process of making mandala increases one's level of patience and focus. It took me away me from my issues, and now I just can't imagine my life without it.

Can you tell me more about your process?

It's a very simple process. It begins with a centre circle. It ends up with large symmetry of circles which you can interlace with your own imagination. There are no restrictions. You can include all designs and you don't have to stick to norms. But one requires an extreme level of patience

and focus. One cannot fast track the process. The result shows one's pace.

How has the response

The response has been quite immense. If not for the enthusiastic response, I wouldn't be here. People have approached me to ask, "Do you sell your work?" I told myself," I must be doing something good because people want to purchase my work." I didn't have any formal training in mandala art, but people are very interested in my work process. Thus I started to organize workshops and made this studio so that I can share this

THE ARTIST IN ME

Nehasha Pokhrel's art pieces go beyond simple aesthetic beauty, and are reflections of her own emotions and aspirations.

Aakanchya Tamang, In Conversation with Nehasha Pokhrel



I WAS BORN in Kathmandu but my upbringing is from Biratnagar which is why I always keep this place very close to my heart. Ever since my childhood, I have always known that I was a creative person but didn't have any field where I showed any keen interest in. After completing my school here, I shifted to Bangalore for my further studies and better education prospects to get my Bachelor's Degree in Arts. During my stay there, I had a pretty good job lined up for me as I worked in Emporio Armani as a fashion consultant but even during those times, I always felt it in my heart that something was missing and I am not serving the purpose that I am supposed to. I always wanted to do something meaningful and bring changes in the society, so I quit my job and came back to my home country where I started my volunteer work with VSO Nepal. During the

time, I was very fortunate enough to get the opportunities to work in the remote areas of Nepal in Baglung and Surkhet Districts where I got to interact with children from the marginalized communities and work in projects that aimed to

bring gender inclusiveness and equality in the society.

As for my interest in painting, it came to me during the lowest times in my life and it sort of served as a purpose of an escape from the tough times I went through. I had no idea that I would be someone who could paint as I started by only scribbling colors on a paper to distract myself. As I got more involved, I started to realize how much it made me feel at peace. So I slowly shifted from water colors to acrylic paints and papers to canvases to channel my energy and thoughts into my art. It was such a continuous and spontaneous process and the rest just went with the flow.

I recently participated in an exhibition and for me rather than fame or money, it was a self-help technique and a means for conveying the message in my art. I was actually taken aback when my paintings were the highest selling among all the other paintings. As overwhelmed as I was with all the appreciation and love that my art received, I was happier with the fact that it helped me feel content and helped me find who I really am and what I am meant to do. I still suffer from insomnia and panic attacks but now that I have my art with me, I feel really strong.

Talking about my work, I initially started with blue and white colors as they always brought me peace and

made me happy. I paint still water and waves and let all my emotions out when I paint. Then, gradually I shifted to more of acrylic colors and painted the beauty yet the suffering of women in our society. I wanted to focus on the mental health of women and how important it is to take into attention the seriousness of this problem. It was to address the controversy of how women in our society are always judged for their choices, their actions or I would say, simply for being a woman. Through my art, I want to bring light into these problems so that we would talk about the trauma that these women go through and come out of this. There are a lot of paintings that I would love to talk about but the one that is very close to my heart is "Tridevi," which is the story of three women where I have used vibrant colors to portray the beauty of women and their untold story.

As for the future, I don't know what it holds but I know that I aspire to be happy. The main reason I came to art was to get out of a low phase in my life and channel my emotions but now I plan to join art school and learn art professionally and continue to do what I love.

I want to let people know how therapeutic art is and how it has helped me bring changes in my own life and teach them that no matter what kind of situation that they are in, they can always pull themselves out of it if they believe in themselves and continue doing things that bring them joy. For me, my art was become more that a platform for my sad emotions. Now, it is more about my happy emotions, women and their mental health and the positivity that I want to spread in the world through it.

> women is breast cancer. Although breast cancer isn't directly linked with food, when people who are biologically predisposed to it get

exposed to unfavorable environment condition, unbalanced diet, and hormone imbalance then chances of getting breast cancer increases for them. On the other hand 5-10% of breast cancer patients get the disease through heredity as well.

Sapana, after the diagnosis of the disease, initially failed to find any breast cancer survivors and began losing her hope of continuing her life. She doubted the chances of her survival and even considered not getting any treatment. However after some research and inquiry she began various ayurvedic treatments which in reality didn't benefit her as much. She eventually got an operation done during her second stage of cancer and proceeded with her chemotherapy sessions at Nepal Cancer Hospital. Despite the many treatment and medications her cancer still had not left her completely. Consequently she went through a successful surgery which, along with her medications, assisted her in finally becoming cancer free along.

Her overall journey has not only been that of physical difficulty but also a rollercoaster of emotions which in turn has enabled her to become mentally stronger. Through her experience she'd like to encourage other such cancer patients to not lose hope, but rather seek for the best and most suitable solutions. Although Nepal isn't renowned for its medical services, she believes that being treated in Nepal itself is reliable and trustworthy. She'd like to encourage any patient to not delay their treatment process and carry it out as soon as possible because she believes that loss of time is loss of life.

MARUNI SANCTAURY LODGE

is located to the south-west of Saunderban and next to Kumrose community forest, in the outskirt of Chitwan National Park. It is 22 km away from the domestic airport and 2.5 km from the tourist bus park at Sauraha. A humble establishment which chooses to embody the local culture in all its facets it's a welcoming site after a long journey. Checking in was a breeze, with the smiling faces of the staff you just wander if you've met them before.

A wary traveller has an array of rooms to choose from. The cottage rooms built in jungle style architecture, each with a patio is perfect if you wish to experience home style comfort. The 12 cottage rooms come equipped with bathroom amenities, slippers, mineral water, and free Wi-Fi. For those who wish to have a much more secluded abode, the Hunters Den is the perfect pick. Nestled in the forest area of the hotel it is completely secluded from the rest of the rooms. The three

hunters den come equipped with the same amenities as the cottage room, but also boast a splendid view of the Machan and a pond quite often visited by the alligators from the nearby river. The Long House features a total of 10 rooms, sharing the long house patio. The rooms are much more spacious and perfect for a family night in. If one fancies a suite room, then the Karna's Cabin is the one to go for. The totals of six suite rooms feature a spacious interior with a in room sitting and a balcony with a view.











Exhausted from the five hour commute from Kathmandu to Chitwan, the team of Maruni at the bus station were a welcome sight. Arriving at the premises, which to be honest would go unnoticed if you were just taking a casual stroll down the lane, as it embodied the local architecture. I believe it didn't wish to stand out from the crowd, like many of the other establishments at the

national park region.

With the welcome drink served, and the cottage room chosen it was finally time to relax and take in the fresh air as it is a novelty in Kathmandu. The estate was massive, with most of it being dominated by pristine flora. It was not just home to us travellers who wished to experience the park, but also to hundreds of species of fauna who call these lands home. I was content knowing, that the establishment that I reside in, understands the essence of sustainable development and environmental integration.

The dinner was more than what I had expected. The earth watch restaurant, a picturesque dinning hall, in sync with the local architecture had a warm ambience that soothed travellers. Talking to the team, I was informed that all the ingredients were locally sourced and the taste justified that statement in full.

The wake up call at six am, at first felt like a drag as all I wanted to do was sleep more which normally doesn't happen. We set out on your jungle venture, guided by the expertise of Sashim Chaudhary who has been associated with the establishment since its foundation. He along

with a companion form the park office, ensured our safety in the vast wilderness and gave us ample knowledge of what surrounded us.

The jungle walk, for us city dwellers take us right into the moments of Jurassic Park. An amalgam of excitement, fear and euphoria keep us at edge and the jungle that never seems to end at times we wish it never ends.

Stopping by the river side, for breakfast neatly packed with love by the team, we set out yet again. After hours of trailing the majestic jungles, we made our way back to Maruni. A brief stop for lunch and we out again, on your merry adventure this time on four wheels. One has the option to choose between a Jeep safari and an elephant safari. We choose the comfort of a Jeep, which I later regretted as most of my encounters with the wildlife have been on the back of a living beast. Blessed with a guide, we meet during our jungle walk in the morning who had ample experience and knowledge of the safari trails. The safari was disappointing I must say, wouldn't any be if you didn't spot the king of the jungle?

A quick stop at the gharial breeding centre, I was amazed to how they had maintained the establishment and put in new additions as well. The return trip was a time of deep contemplation of how if one perseveres progress can be achieved. Returning to our adobe, refreshing ourself with a shower and warm tea. We set out to explore the

vast estate of Maruni. It felt like a microcosm of the park in tune with its environment provided sanctuary to not just us but the flora and fauna as well.

Beautiful Poland





An Avian Legacy

Mrs. Meena Dangol and her daughter Mrs. Lasana S M Shrestha share with us their aspirations, love for art and their family legacy. Mrs. Meena Dangol she shares with her passion for bringing to life in canvases.

IN THIS FAST-moving world, personal desires and dreams usually take precedence over other things. We rarely find individuals who strive to make their parents' dream come true before their own. Rarely we find a family, whose legacy lines the halls and courts of Kings and great institutions. And even more rarely do we find people with the desire to keep that legacy despite over-whelming odds and changing times. Mrs. Meena Dangol is the daughter of late Hira Lal Dangol, who is considered a pioneer of bird painting in Nepal. Meena's daughter Mrs. Lasana Singh Maharjan Shrestha, professionally a banker, has endeavored to bring to life her childhood desire of organizing a solo exhibition for her mother. Here they share with us, their stories, and what inspired them to bring their family legacy to the public eye.

How long have you been in this field? Did you get inspired by seeing your father? MD: I remember being around 14 or 15 years when I started painting. Being brought up in an artistic environment, watching my father and my brothers paint, I used to be intrigued and my curiosity grew as I got older. While other kids my age used to go outside and play, I guess, I sort of made my canvas a playground and created a sanctum to call my own. I explored my passion and dedicated my time to learn the required artistic skills.

Do you use the same techniques and style vour father and where did the inspiration to paint owls come from? MD: My father used water colors for most of his paintings but I like to use acrylic and various shades of canvas.

What is the most rewarding thing about being an artist for you?

MD: What I love most about being an artist is the feeling I get every time I begin to paint a piece. It feels like I am dwelling into a world of my own. It has always been a way of expression for me. I love how all my focus is dedicated toward the canvas when I paint. I found a profession and it has led to fame but the most important aspect is the satisfaction of being able to follow my dreams and bring my passion to life. Most of my friends pursued various fields in their careers. My parents' inspired and encouraged me to pursue art. It is the greatest gift that I have ever received.

Your father, is known as the first bird painter of Nepal after Raj Man Singh Chitrakar. Can you give us an insight about his passion to paint birds and where he got his inspiration from?

MD: My father was a banker. In that era it was a very noble profession. But he risked it all by leaving a job which had a good pay and prestige to start from scratch and pursue his love and passion art. Even as a child when he studied at Durbar High School, he dedicated most of his time to painting. He was an apprentice of Lain Singh Bangdel, one of the most renowned artists of Nepal and followed his footsteps. My father was the illustrators of 700+ paintings in the book "Birds of Nepal" published in 1976 by Dr. Robert Felimg Sr., his son Dr. Robert Flaming Jr. and Lain Singh Bangdel which still remains one of the authoritative works in Nepal.

His history, his passion and his works have been presented honorably in a book called the Birds of Nepal, written by Dr. Dina Bangdel, who herself has contributed in the field of art.

Can you give us an insight about your recent exhibition and

the inspiration behind it?

MD: This exhibition is titled, Hira by Meena Dangol. Planned by my daughter, it features my most prominent art pieces in tribute to my father Hira Dangol. It has a collection of my paintings, which specialize in portrayal of various species of owls. I get asked a lot about why I mostly paint owls. The eyes of an owl have mystery. Their deep darkness bring out curiosity in me of the world they have seen. It is also the carrier of the Goddess Laxmi, who is highly regarded in the Hindu Pantheon and is the goddess of wealth and good fortune. My husband's name is also Laxmi (laughs).

In your experience, how much recognition have you gained or offered to you in Nepal?

MD: My father is one of the renowned artists of Nepal. When you google him, his paintings can be seen hung in the walls of the Royal Palace, the president's palace, and numerous five stars hotel and institutions in Nepal.

I am an artist, but I am also a mother. I devoted most of my time to my children and my daughter Lasana has always told me, "It is time that the world gets to behold your artistry, witness its mystery and share your curiosity. It is time for you to achieve and acquire the recognition you truly deserve."

In 2016, we organized a family exhibition, "Birds of Nepal: The Art of Heera Lal Dangol and His Family Legacy." The works of my father, and four siblings were showcased at Nepal Art Council. The admiration and the recognition that our family got was very inspirational which is why my loving daughter wanted to initiate another exhibition which will be my solo exhibition. I feel blessed and hope that my children carry forth the legacy of the "Bird Artist Family of Nepal" for generations to come.

You have been planning your mothers exhibition. How long has it been in your list? LS: In my list? Ever since I was a kid. Ever since I can remember, I have seen my maternal side paint these exquisite pieces of art, that are belief. Each painting has a story to tell and it is just so majestic. I always felt that my maternal grandfather got the recognition he deserved for his talents but my mother didn't.

LS: Each and every moment, I must say. She dedicated so much for our upbringing and sacrificed so much. I am always grateful for that and every moment I got to spend with her I cherish. The proudest moment, is the speech that my mother gave at our last family exhibition. I initiated that exhibition, prior to which art was a just a hobby for my mom. A medium of carrying on the legacy of the gene of

artistry within them. For them it has never been about acquisition of fame but rather an extension of themselves. The exhibition was a success and that filled me with pride, and watching my mother deliver the keynote was the cherry on top.

Your favourite painting of your mother.

LS: The painting of the focus owl, she gifted me on my wedding. Her dedication to detail can be seen in the vivid strokes that captured every fiber, and what makes it my favorite is the love that went into filling that canvas.

Did you ever think of becoming an artist?

LS: I paint, not to the extent my mother and maternal family. But now, as I have come of age and as I get more 'older and wiser,' I have realized the importance of carrying on the legacy of my family. I must say I am a work in progress and I hope to keep the legacy going. After a few years, I plan to completely step into the world of art, learn and honor my family. How to choose the Right kindergarten?

Zenana Ojha, In Conversation with Sandy Ramsey, Early Childhood Director at Swostishree Gurukhul

THE CONCEPT OF a kindergarten still feels new to most parents in Nepal. They have always been depending upon family to take care of their children and having these children placed in a facility is still a stigma for many. For working parents, who have busy schedules, kindergarten have been a boon. But with so many kindergartens to choose from, parents understandably get confused when it comes to picking a right kindergarten for their children. Thus, through a conversation with Sandy Ramsey, principal of Swostishree Gurukul preschool, we would like to bring to our readers, what to look for when choosing the right kindergarten.

HOW DOES BEING ENROLLED IN KINDERGARTEN BENEFIT THE CHILDREN?

I believe the main purpose of a kindergarten is the development of socialization skills among children rather than their academic expansion. I believe being enrolled in kindergarten will allow children to become more familiar with the school-like environment, and will teach them how to be principled, cooperative, and collaborative. Additionally it will also teach them different ways they can become a better communicator so they will be able to share their problems, ideas, etc.

WHAT CRITERIAS SHOULD THE KINDERGARTEN MEET TO BE THE RIGHT CHOICE FOR ONE'S CHILD?

The criteria the kindergarten has to meet in order to be the right choice depends upon what the parents are looking for. I have come to notice parents in Nepal seek what is academically stringent for their child since an early age. However



too much academics too soon tend to damage children for long term which in fact has been confirmed by many research. Although parent may want to pursue a more highly academic environment for their child I believe every kindergarten should rather prioritize provision of ample playtime. Hence kindergartens should consist of proper infrastructure and adequate space for children. Likewise there should also be the availability of facilities which allow children to carry out various activities which may evidently enhance their other skills such as problem solving skills. Thus, in a kindergarten I believe the elements which allow development of socialization skills rather than academic skills should be fulfilled.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN KINDERGARTEN EXPERIENCE AND DIRECT SCHOOLING?

Although kindergarten is not necessarily essential, children who weren't enrolled in a kindergarten may go through a tougher time adjusting to grade school as they will not be familiar with the school environment. They may have a harder time interacting, playing, and communicating compared to the ones who have already been exposed to the environment during their kindergarten phase. Often children who've been to academic kindergarten may be ahead in studies during their first years of schooling. But in terms of academics, children who haven't been to kindergarten will catch up. Thus kindergarten experience ultimately will enable the children to become familiar with the learning environment, and will teach them the basic fundamentals which will help in making their transition to school smooth.





WE'VE ALL HEARD similar statements before - be it telling them to your kids or your parents telling them to you. Just like going to the gym or doing jumping jacks in the morning exercises your body, playing such games exercises your mind. And exercising your mind is just as important as exercising your body.

Many studies have been conducted throughout the world on the effect of Video Games. So far, most of the results have been positive (unless your child is super addicted to video gaming). Allowing a child to play puzzle games every day for some amount of time will help him/her learn a vast array of skills in a fun and an entertaining manner. Thanks to the rapid penetration of smartphones into the public domain and a large number of puzzle games being developed, your child isn't only limited to ancient puzzles like Lego Bricks, Jigsaw Puzzles or Chess.

The game basically revolves around the player making way for a piece of a block to get out of the maze. As you progress, the levels become much harder thus allowing you to think harder. Unblock me is just one example out of many. There are thousands of other games out there that will really benefit the growing brain of a child (and also adults).

Recognizing Shapes is a very useful skill as a child. There are many games out there that allow the player to use shapes to solve puzzles. Tangram games are an excellent example of shape recognition games. In such games, the player is tasked with making various shapes by using smaller shapes. Just typing Tangram Games on Google Play store yields hundreds of Tangram related games. Make sure you have one of these games installed on your phones.

Moving on, memory is a very important part of the brain. Most puzzle games revolve around memorizing. Children in particular don't really like memorizing in a traditional manner but if memorizing goes alongside playing a fun game, kids will love it. These memory games eventually help children develop a solid memory which is always a good thing.

Dopamine is known as the happy chemical. It's released in the brain

every time you achieve something. Be it falling in love, getting a raise or simply talking to an old friend. When kids play puzzle games and they solve a problem, they feel a sense of achievement and become more confident and develop their selfesteem. Good self-esteem is a solid foundation for a good person.

Elevate App - available both on Google Play and the App Store is an excellent app that has a collection of brain development games that support memorizing, fast reading, shape recognition and what not.

Now, these are all puzzle games but what about those pesky little violent games where the player takes a massive gun and goes on a killing spree? Surprisingly, playing these games develops hand eye coordination as the player needs to look at the screen, control the player, aim the gun and fire it precisely. Thus, they also develop multitasking skills in the child. Keep in mind that these games have some amount of graphic elements so it's not really recommended for toddlers.

Simulation games are another category of games that also have their fair share of benefits to the children. Most of these games don't have a particular problem to be solved. However, a player must use his/her creativity and imagination to play these games. And therefore is also much beneficial to a child.

A single good song or piece of music you listen can change the whole mood of



A PERSON'S LIFESTYLE lifestyle choices and environment have a direct impact on their health. Since many people these days they tend to forget to make time for their health, they suffer any number of medical conditions. One such condition is Nerve Compression.

WHAT IS NERVE COMPRESSION AND WHAT PARTS OF THE BODY DOES IT AFFECT THE MOST?

Nerve Compression is also known as Compression Neuropathy, and it is a

type of medical condition caused due to direct pressure to the nerves. In most cases it affects a patient's neck and waist but it can affect any part of the body depending on the type of pressure on the nerves.

Some of its symptoms are chronic pain, tingling sensations, numbness, and burning sensations in the affected areas. Prolonged exposure to pressure in the affected regions can lead to muscle weakness and muscle atrophy.

WHAT ARE ITS CAUSES AND CAN ANY OTHER UNDERLYING **DISEASES CAUSE NERVE** COMPRESSION?

Nerve Compression can have any number of causes from something as simple as repeated incorrect posture of the body parts to physical trauma from accidents or falls. In some cases, the nerves can also be compressed due to tumor or diabetes, which can make the nerves susceptible to even the slightest amount of pressure resulting in nerve compression.

Many people tend to suffer from Nerve Compression in the neck and back. In these cases, it happens due to slight movement in the intervertebral disc of the spinal cord which puts the surrounding nerves under pressure. This is mostly due to incorrect sitting posture for a prolonged period.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS AND LIKELY WAYS TO GET AFFECTED?

One can experience Nerve Compression at any moment in his or her life. In most cases it is due to prolonged and repeated external force to the affected areas which tends to create discomfort in the affected areas. This can lead to numbness and muscle weakness in the areas which can eventually lead to constant pain, difficulty in movement of the limbs, muscle atrophy and even paralysis.

A significant number of cases stem from prolonged incorrect postures of the body parts such as neck, arms, hands and back.

HOW IS NERVE COMPRESSION DIAGNOSED?

Diagnosis of Nerve Compression depends on which nerve is affected, where along its length it is affected, and how seriously it is affected. Usually, tingling sensations, reduced sensations, pain, and numbness are more than enough for its diagnosis. This is one of the methods applied by medical professionals in their clinical practice.

Alternatively, when the above mentioned procedures are ineffective in diagnosis, an MRI scan is done. This way an in depth analysis of the affected part is presented and the patient is diagnosed accordingly. This method is applied if the patient is unsure about whether they have Nerve Compression or not and

ARE THERE ANY PREVENTION MEASURES FOR IT?

There are number of prevention measures for Nerve Compression, that can be easily picked up by people. Regular exercise, regular physical checkups, taking rest, taking breaks in between working sessions, taking care of physical posture are a few examples of the prevention measures. People need to be more proactive toward getting themselves checked if they have a higher than average physical discomfort.

Additionally, people need to more aware of the physical strain that puts on their body due to their work and social environment. By doing so they can shift more focus on their well-being and prevent not just Nerve Compression but a variety of other medical conditions.

WHAT TREATMENT OPTIONS ARE AVAILABLE FOR PEOPLE WITH THIS CONDITION?

The treatment for Nerve Compression depends on the underlying causes. There are primarily two treatment options for patients diagnosed with Nerve Compression.

First is the therapeutically option which includes physical therapy, natural therapy and ayurvedic therapy. These methods are where the patient's affected areas are put in focus and the condition is treated accordingly with physical treatments, diets, medication, ayurvedic medicine etc. Generally, any one of these is enough for treatment but a combination of them can benefit the patient and the treatment can be done quicker.

The second treatment option is surgery and it is reserved for extreme cases. Surgery is only reserved in particular cases and depends on the severity of the symptoms. Cases that could lead to paralysis, carpal tunnel syndrome, cubital tunnel syndrome are examples where prompt surgery is needed to be performed on the patient.



Located at Pulchowk, near Himalayan Bank, Taaza has been serving genuine and delicious Syrian cuisine in Nepal since last four years. I was quite disappointed at myself for not finding this place earlier than I did. As I entered, the place seemed cozy with a homely ambience and fascinating wall paintings. Being greeted with a friendly smile has always been a determining factor for me about a restaurant's image and as soon as I entered here, I felt welcomed which already made me like the place.

I got an opportunity to interact with the owner, who is from Syria and who decided to open a restaurant with his Nepalese wife to serve Syrian food in Nepal as he saw the lack of authentic Syrian food here. He wanted to bring forward the true culture and flavor of Syrian food. The place offers unparalleled taste of Syrian cuisine and I got to learn a lot about its history, origins and inspirations behind it. With much excitement I ordered three dishes which were a must have Syrian dishes.

My first dish was their Chicken Kebab with Pita Bread, presented beautifully with a side of relish with fries and mixed sauce. The kebab tasted distinct from any of the kebabs I've had till now because the chicken was rather minced in a keema machine with different masalas and later on grilled. No wonder it had such a supple taste to it and felt earthy and smoky. The sauce was a clever combination with the kebab that all together brought such mouthwatering flavors that I didn't want it to finish.


The next dish was their Chicken Shawarma which was again served with a side of fries, salad and mixed sauce. The whole dish might paint a picture of a regular dish you get at a restaurant but the dish incorporated flavors that are bound to surprise you in an unexpected way. The dish is cooked in a clever manner where chickens are stacked vertically in a Shawarma machine. Then it is cooked slowly by rotating the machine so that all the flavors and fat of the chicken are absorbed by the chicken itself rather than going to waste to bring out the rich and juicy flavor of the chicken. Then the chicken is packed with delicious vegetables to bring out

a fresh and pleasant taste and
wrapped in a thin roti. The
chicken was plump and

exquisite flavors, the dish is a

I would come back for more and suggest my friends to try as well.

Last but not the least, trying Falafel for the first time was something new for me but a great choice on my part. I am definitely adding this dish to my list of favorite food considering how deceptively simple it looked with minimal flavors but tasted marvelous in every way. It was prepared by mincing chick peas in a keema machine and adding ingredients like onion, masalas and garlic to bring out the flavors. At the end, it is deep fried to bring a nice crunchy flavor that is sure to attract many people's attention. With a side of hummus sauce (also my new favorite) that is prepared by cooking in a pressure cooker and blended with lemon, salt and sesame, it was a wonderful and different dish that fulfills your cravings in every way. The dish is a clever combination and the crunchiness of the outer layer of the falafel was light and fluffy a perfect touch to this perfect dish.

All in all, this is a place one must visit to explore more of the best Syrian cuisine. Being someone who has always liked staying true to her roots and preferring Nepalese food by being hesitant to try other cuisines, I would without a doubt say that trying Syrian food has seriously made me reconsider my choices and explore for more. I can't wait to visit Taaza again and try other new Syrian dishes in the future.

When I visited Nizam's House, I was quite impressed with the menu they had and the price that came with it. The first dish I got to savor was their Chicken 65. The reason I ordered is the name that convinced me the dish would be something not to miss. When it arrived, my mouth had already started watering. It not only looked good but tasted as heavenly as it could get. I could feel a burst of exceptionally great flavors in my mouth with juicy chicken and different flavors. What I also loved about the dish is how every flavor and element of the dish went unexpectedly well together without overpowering the other. When I asked the owners about the reason behind its name, I came to know that the name chicken 65 came together as the chicken was made by incorporating 65 flavors native to India. No wonder it tasted so good. It was a perfect starter.

My second dish was a heaven for all mo:mo lovers of the town. The mo:mo platter of this place is a new menu in which mo:mos have been twisted with a traditional touch in which various Indian flavors have been added to serve four different types of mo:mos. The plate consisted of 16 pieces of

different varieties of mo:mos that consisted of tandoori mo:mos of two types, sadheko mo:mos and regular steamed mo:mos. All of them were beautifully executed and garnished with veggies that were very appetizing. They were infused with Hyderabadi spices with tandoori spices and roasted in a tandoor. The platter looked inviting and each one of them had a distinct and orgasmically delicious taste. The best part about the delicious food has to be how it was ingredient focused and had

The last dish that I tasted was their Hyderabadi Biryani which is rumored to be the best in town. When I tasted, I found out that, the rumors were actually true at least for me. In conversation with the owner, I got to know that the chef himself is one of the best from Hyderabad and the biryani is cooked with masala native to Hyderabad. Served with gravy and raita, the biryani is a heaven for all biryani fans out there. The rice just melted in the mouth, the chicken of the biryani was succulent and the overall biryani was not oily yet light, fluffy and very appetizing. All the flavors in the biryani were beautifully paired enough to take you into food coma. The gravy had

a modern twist.

a thick consistency and was packed with flavors that one would surely remember. The biryani was generously served and would be more than enough for three people to enjoy.

Nizam's House is a must visit if you love experimenting with food and specially if you are a huge fan of biryani. It is the great place with a homely ambience where you can go out for family dinners. The service staff has a friendly disposition and treated me with the utmost respect. I felt very welcomed and with ample of space on the ground floor and also on the top, I would add that the ground floor feels more suitable for family gatherings and dinners or business meetings, while the top floor, with its relaxed ambience, is where you can enjoy the view of the city, hang out with your friends for lunch, or have a candle light dinner or simply a nice date when you are on a budget.

HOW HAVE YOU SEEN THE E-COMMERCE INDUSTRY IN NEPAL?

E-Commerce was not as it is today; it started with a concept. I don't want to say it was something that was innovated at home. Sites that provided the services of hamrobazar had already made a huge impact in the global arena, because it was practical and easy to do. As the internet took off, it eased communication and gave access to all.

I knew that someday it would grow and this is the right foot forward. I realized that something had to be done. Visit each shop, explain the same narrative to each and hope that we get a quote close to our expectation.





will have a difficult time filling the phone completely but if you do, the shared SIM slot does have a microSD slot which can expand your storage space up to 1 TB. The only down side being you lose the ability to utilize the dual sim feature.

When it comes to optics, Samsung never fails to deliver. The triple array back camera houses three lenses each tuned for wide view, telephoto and ultra wide. The wide and telephoto lenses are 12 MP each with aperture openings of f1.5-2.4 and f/2.4 respectively whereas the ultra-wide

lens features a 16 MP camera with an opening of f/2.2. In layman terms, these features allows users to switch between optics according to ones surrounding for amazing pictures. The front camera on the other hand is a 10MP camera at 26mm delivering ultra wide selfies. The aperture of f/1.9 helps it take in more light in darker and night settings.

With stereo speakers, the highlight has to be the headphone jack. Yes the headphone jack its not a typo, it definitely has a headphone jack. The active noise cancellation with a

dedicated mic means, the person on the other hand will not have a hard time listening in even the loudest environment and the Dolby Atmos/ AKG sound delivers premium audio both through the loudspeaker and the jack. The phone is equipped with a whole host of sensors, with an under display fingerprint sensor, accelerometer, gyro, proximity, compass, barometer and a hear rate sensor.

Any phone might boast great specifications, but without a great battery it's just a brick.
